

## ***Гадаад хэлээр хэвлэгдэх материалд тавигдах шаардлага***

Гадаад хэлээр хэвлэгддэг “World affairs” сэтгүүлд англи, орос, хятад хэлээр бичигдсэн судалгааны материалыг ирүүлэх бөгөөд дараах шаардлага хангагдсан байвал зохистой.

### ***Parts of the Manuscript***

1. Submitted manuscripts shouldn't exceed 10,000 words (including footnotes, references, appendices and tables, figures, charts, ect) and should be original works and must not be submitted elsewhere while under consideration by World Affairs. The journal also accepts book reviews, research notes, reports and interviews which shouldn't exceed more than 2000 words.
2. Authors should provide a brief bio data (100 words or fewer), an abstract (150-250 words), keywords /5-10 words/, and references /less than 3 pages/.
3. Notes should be few as possible and appear at the end of the text.
4. Footnotes should be included using the tools available in the MS Word application. Do not insert footnotes manually.
5. The Author –Date system of The Chicago Manual of Style should be followed while citing the references ([http://www.chicagomanualofstyle.org/tools\\_citationguide.html](http://www.chicagomanualofstyle.org/tools_citationguide.html)).
6. Works cited in the text should be listed alphabetically under references, beginning on a separate of paper.

The source should be cited. Citation style is the same as the footnote style. Each table or figure should have individual numbering.
