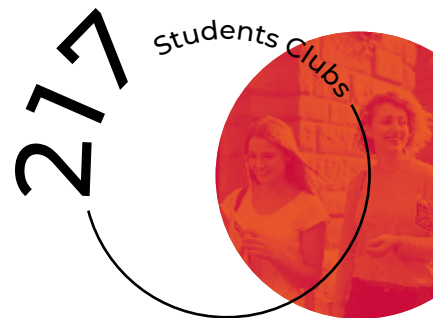
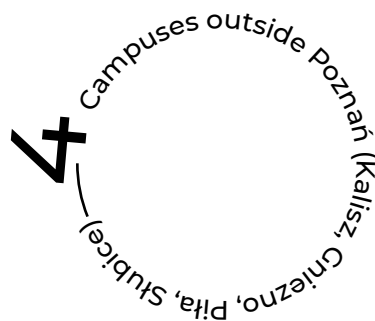
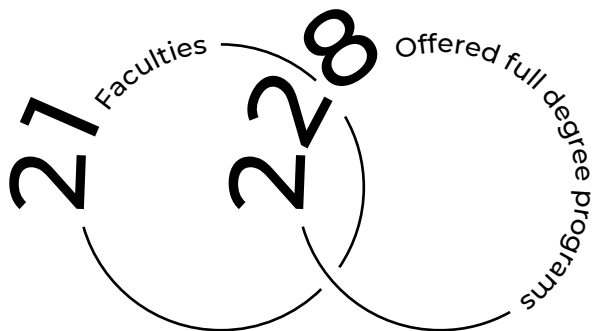

Exchange students

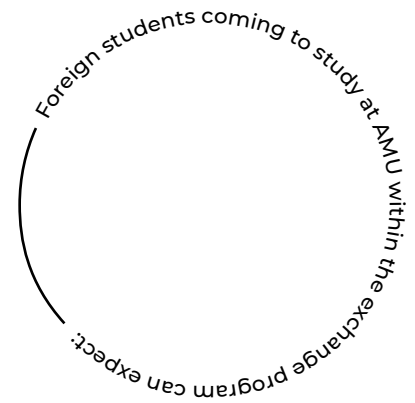
Erasmus+ program at AMU has attracted 27 EU countries, 3 EEA countries (Iceland, Lichtenstein and Norway), Turkey as a candidate country, Republic of North Macedonia, plus 15 partner countries (such as Canada, USA, Japan, Taiwan, Serbia, Mozambique, Senegal, Armenia, Ukraine, Algeria, Russia, Philippines, Kazakhstan, Mexico, and Peru).

Exchange based on bilateral agreements: if you wish to study at AMU as an exchange student, you have to be a student of a higher education institution already. Using Bilateral Agreements option You can study at AMU for one/two semesters with no tuition fee charged, receiving a student ID and discounts.

Guest students and free movers:

You are welcome to come to AMU as a guest student and free movers for one semester or a year.

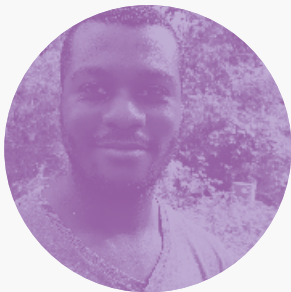

NanoBioMedical Centre

NanoBioMedical Centre is the result of a partnership of four Poznań universities: Adam Mickiewicz University, Poznań University of Medical Sciences, University of Life Sciences and Poznań University of Technology. Since 2018, it has had the status of a scientific unit. The Centre has an interdisciplinary character, combining physical, chemical, biological, medical and material engineering sciences. The main objective of the Centre is research and teaching of nanoscience and nanotechnology. The research focuses on the production, description and testing of the potential of nanomaterials used, in therapy and diagnostics, tissue engineering or nanoelectronics.

The Centre is a modern laboratory equipped with unique research equipment, scientific staff and doctoral students carrying out interdisciplinary projects. Students have the opportunity to develop their scientific passions and acquire unique knowledge. The Centre also cooperates with over 40 foreign and domestic partner research centres.

Wielkopolska Centre of Advanced Technologies

This is a multidisciplinary scientific centre located within the Morasko Campus. Its task is to bring together the most outstanding Polish scientists from the field of natural and technical sciences, as well as the most talented doctoral students, scientists from Poznań and European specialists.

The Centre carries out research and development projects and conducts experimental research work focusing on new materials, biomaterials and nanomaterials with various applications. The results of this work are disseminated through teaching, publications and technology transfer. The Centre has started working on developing a serological test for SARS-CoV-2, immunodiagnosics and creating a meniscus implant using a modern 3D bio-printer.

The Centre has an advanced research infrastructure and modern laboratory facilities. It constitutes a bridge between science and industry and as such cooperates with the broadly understood economy.

The Centre's partners are five Poznań universities (Adam Mickiewicz University, Poznań – coordinator, University of Medical Sciences, University of Life Sciences, University of Economics and Business and Poznań University of Technology), four institutes of the Polish Academy of Sciences (Bioorganic Chemistry, Plant Genetics, Human Genetics and Molecular Physics) in Poznań Science and Technology Park and the Institute of Natural Fibres and Herbal Plants.

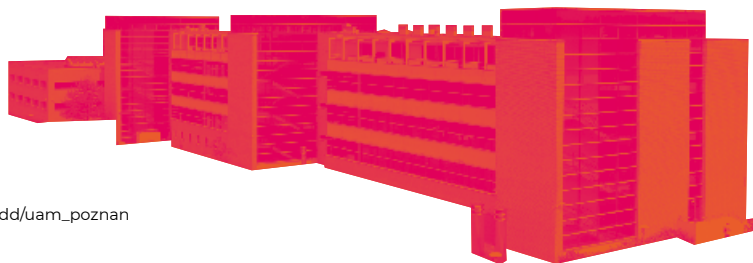
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
